

K696 SCIP Database: New SVHC Reporting

The European Waste Framework Directive 2008/98/EC (Waste Framework Directive) was amended in May 2018. This amending directive 2018/851 provides for numerous innovations. Among other things, information must now be provided by companies for substances of very high concern (SVHC) according to the REACH candidate list.

The European Chemicals Agency (ECHA) was commissioned to provide a database for the data to be submitted by 5 January 2020. The prototype of this SCIP database (Substances of Concern In articles, as such or in complex objects (Products)) is now available. The obligation to report begins on 5 January 2021.
