

Supply chain example



- OEM is forced to establish a process and release a report to show that he fullfills the LkSG requirements
- Tier 1 receives the request to show evidence of beeing compliant to LkSG from OEM *
- Tier 1 must ask **all** of his sub-suppliers (Tier 2) if they fullfill LkSG, for beeing able to report back to the OEM
- This goes down all the way to "Tier n" and in the end back to the OEM
- * If the Tier 1 or any other supplier within this chain has reached the employees threshold, they also are forced by law to do the esteblishment and reporting

All suppliers within the supply chain are directly or indirectly affected

- 1. Adoption of a **declaration of principles** by the company management on the human rights strategy (Gem. §6 Abs. 2 S.2)
- 2. Establishment of **risk management** in all relevant business processes (§4). At least annual **risk analyses** to identify risks in the company's own business area and with direct suppliers (§5)
- 3. Establishment of a complaints procedure
- 4. Occurrence-based risk analysis, preventive measures and **remedial actions** at indirect suppliers (§9)
- 5. Implementation of **prevention measures** (§6). Take corrective **action to prevent**, stop, or minimize violations of law (§7)
- 6. Preparation and **publication of a report** on the fulfillment of due diligence obligations (§10)

Kinderarheit heim Miss Abbau in Jharkhand (Indian) /Ente, Este, terre des hammes

- In October 2021, Mica was included in an expansion of the RMI and has since been queried outside
 of the familiar CMRT in the supply chain.
- The template is called EMRT (Extended Minerals Reporting Template).
- A study by the aid organization Terre des Hommes says that up to 22,000 children are mining mica in Indian mines.
- The mineral mica, also known as micaceous earth, is used in dentistry, beauty products, is also used in the automotive industry, for example, in paints, varnishes.
- Mica insulates heat and electricity and is used as a filler.
- Some OEMs have since become members of the "Responsible Mica Initiative".
