6183 Using SCIP in the IMDS


Since the introduction of IMDS Release 13, all IMDS users can transfer MDSs (for products defined by REACH which contain SVHC substances in a concentration above 0.1%) to the SCIP database free of charge using the S2S (system-to-system) interface. To use this application in practice, the respective company must first register with the ECHA and the S2S key must be available and stored in the IMDS. The "SCIP transmissions" can then be used in the IMDS. After successful transmission, you will receive a transmission report from the ECHA by email, which includes the SCIP transmission number as well as the SCIP number. The SCIP application has been developed to include various attributes in Release 13.1 and Release 13.2. The where-used list in the IMDS has also been adapted for this purpose. This makes it possible to identify your own SCIP-relevant MDS (products).

Learning objectives

You will gain an overview of the SCIP reporting requirements and find out what you need to do in the IMDS to safely use the "SCIP transmissions" function. You will also learn how to integrate the existing S2S key into your IMDS account and understand the various SCIP attributes in the IMDS. You will be able to analyze the affected material data sheets (MDS) in the IMDS using the where-used list and independently transmit these MDSs to the SCIP database via the IMDS interface.
